SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH AWARD

We are very proud to have, once again, been recognised for our hard work and commitment to mental health. In October, we were reaccredited with the 'Gold Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health'. We were assessed to be EXCELLING in all areas. The report highlighted the following:

EUROPEAN LANGUAGES DAY

This September we celebrated European Languages Day, we took part in some fantastic activities that developed our understanding of Europe as a continent, and different European languaes. We had some excellent cross-curricular maths on the day- Year 6 were visited by employees of Yorkshire Building Society. They ran a 'Vacation Venture' workshop which explored the different currencies around the world. In groups, the children chose a destination for a holiday and set about







planning flights, hotel stays and activities.

They learned about exchange rates and the importance of budgeting.

We were so lucky to invite several parents into school, who are from different European countries. They spoke to the children about their country of birth, shared lots of interesting facts and had a go at teaching the children their respective language! We were joined by parents and carers from Bulgaria, Slovakia, Latvia, Albania, Romania and Greece. It was a wonderful opportunity for the children and highlighted how we benefit from a diverse school community. A huge thanks to all our parents who joined us for the day!

MUSIC APPRECIATION DAY

We held a music appreciation day this term which was full of music and wonder. Each class studied a different genre. We were particularly impressed with Y5's work, their focus song for the day was "Say my name" by Destiny's child. They spent some time listening and performing the song to understood the rhythm of it. The children discussed how R & B songs traditionally tell a story about artists' pasts and how it is usually inspired by a tough time in their lives. Y5 decided to write their own version of the chorus and perform it to the instrumental version. Some children chose to write about tough times but most of the class invented a new genre of positive R & В.

READING AT SMST

Friday is Book Club afternoon across school, where we explore our class libraries, read with children from other classes, review the books we've been reading, take recommendations from friends and teachers and generally immerse ourselves in the wonderful world of reading.
